## Self-Assessment penalty deadline extended

Today, HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) has announced that Self-Assessment customers will not receive a penalty for filing their 2019-2020 tax return late, as long as the return is filed online by **28 February 2021**.

Customers still need to pay their Self-Assessment tax bill by the **31 January 2021** deadline, with interest being charged from 1 February on any outstanding liabilities.

<u>Please note:</u> Individuals who deferred their 31 July 2020 payment on account must also ensure that this is paid by 31 January 2021, or that the balance is included in a Time To Pay arrangement reached with HMRC (see below).

Don't forget to use your 10-digit Unique Taxpayer Reference (UTR), followed by the letter K, as the payment reference for any electronic payments!

If you owe less than £30,000, you may be able to set up a Time To Pay arrangement to spread payments across up to 12 monthly instalments. You must have filed your 2019-2020 tax return before you can apply for the payment plan, and you will need a Government Gateway account to apply online.
